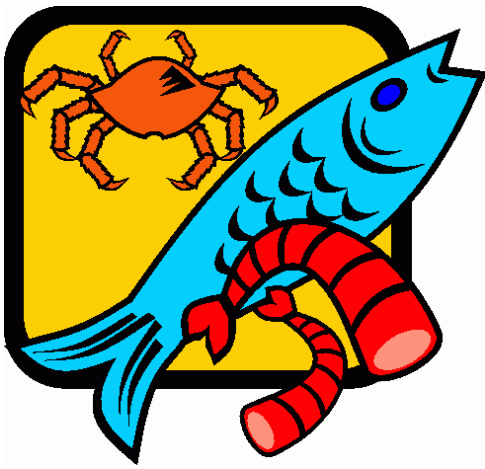

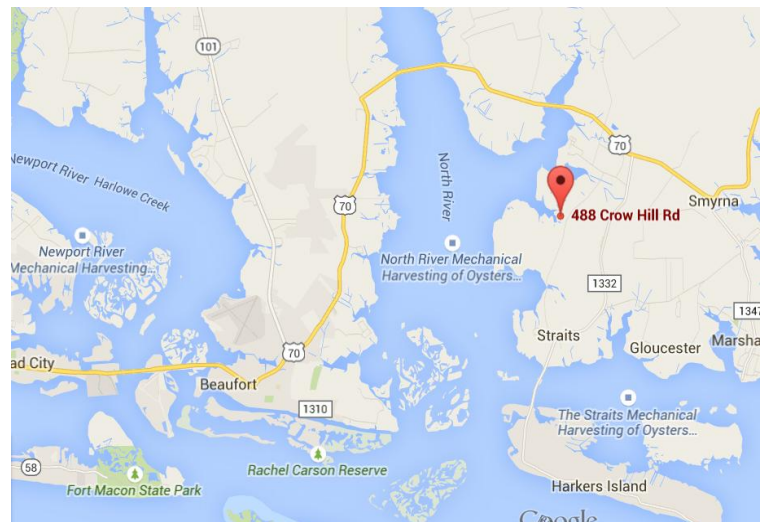

SPRING BOARD MEETING HELD IN RALEIGH

The North Carolina Federation of Republican Women held their Spring Board Meeting May 8-9 at the Sheraton Raleigh. A short business meeting was held highlighting NCFRW President Zan Bunn's presentation *Republican Women → On the Move*. Zan talked about the various ways Republican women in North Carolina are supporting and influencing legislation. She encouraged everyone to get involved.

Club Members Jan Grube, Mary Boughton and Ida Gaskill attended the event.

The Honorable Buck Newton, a three-term state senator from District 11 discussed his responsibilities on the Judiciary and Appropriations committees.

The regional vice presidents gave their reports on the activities of note in their respective regions.

Shortly after the business meeting was adjourned, the 49th Convention and 14th Biennial Convention convened. Nominating Committee Chairman Mary Boughton presented the 2015-2017 slate of officers, which was approved by acclamation. Zan was re-elected as NCFRW President and Kathy Lawler was elected Coastal Region vice president.

Visit www.ncfrw.com to see the list of all the new officers. The NCFRW delegates and delegates-at-large were elected for the 2015 National Federation of Republican Women Biennial Convention slated for September 10-13 in Phoenix, Arizona.

A resolution was adopted in support of Laurie Powell in her quest for North Carolina legislation to enhance mandatory reporting laws by establishing set punishments for convicted perpetrators.



Friday night, Jan, Mary and Ida had the privilege to hear Saira Blair (below, with CCRW President Ida Gaskill), the 18-year-old representative of the West Virginia House of Delegates. She was elected in November 2014 and is currently attending West Virginia University. She is the youngest state lawmaker in the nation. Saira discussed her campaign, reaching nineteen thousand constituents, and her conservative personal and political beliefs.



She is pro-life, pro-family, pro-Second Amendment, pro-jobs, and pro-West Virginia. One of the many reasons she sought the 59th Delegate seat was “to demonstrate to younger people that we shouldn’t wait until we’re 40, 50 or

60 to understand that conservative values and principles are the way to prosperity and success.”

At lunch Saturday, the Honorable Tammy Covil spoke. Ms. Covil serves as the co-chair of the Academic Standards Review Commission which is reviewing Common Core in North Carolina. She is the loudest and only voice on the Commission who stands in opposition of Common Core as it is currently written.
